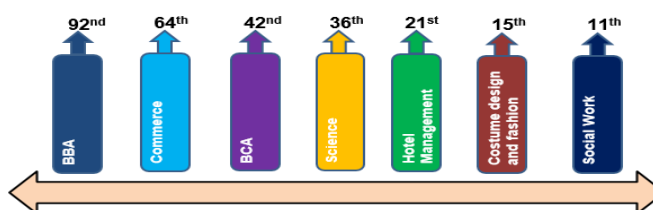

### 3. Teaching and Learning

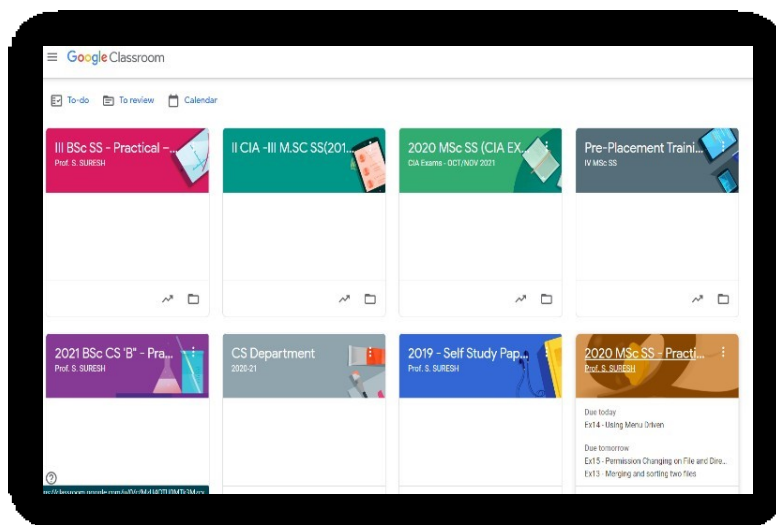

These effective uses of learning technologies have ensured highly modern learning and teaching practices followed in the Institution. All the classrooms of the College are smart classrooms with Active smart boards and LCD projectors and the members of the faculty use digital platforms to handle their classes.

#### Google Classroom

Google classroom is a free blended learning platform to streamline assignments, conduct test and to foster communication. Sri Krishna arts and science College utilise this learning platform in an effective way to educate and engage students during this pandemic. It is a platform that enables a flexible way of learning and teaching. This flexibility and its seamless integration with Google's popular tools are likely what has made Google classroom one of the most widely used ed-tech tools today. 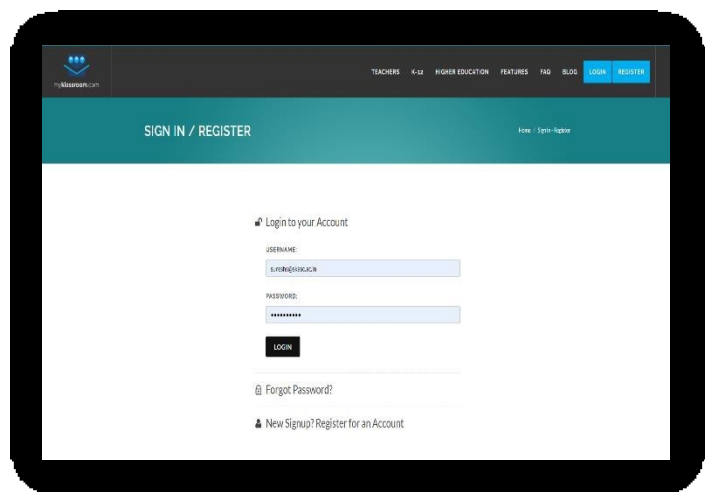

### **Evaluation**

Evaluation is a constant and continuous process in Education and it is a challenging phase in this pandemic. The teaching and learning have under gone a lot of changes from the syllabi to content delivery. The lesson plan for online classes has modified from the regular lesson plan hence every step and aspect of evaluation also customized. The Project Viva-Voce Examinations and practical were conducted online through the existing Infrastructure like Google Meet, Zoom, Cisco meet etc. It was indeed a challenging task for both the students and the invigilators; they took it up cheerfully and succeeded in it. The exams were conducted in the same way as offline exams. Continuous Assessment Tests I and II commence respectively on the 35th and

70th working day of every semester hence SKASC conducted I CIA test on 23.08.2021 and on 04.10.2021 correspondingly for the II, III and PG students. SKASC has been successfully overcoming these hurdles through regular online classes and it has taken a step further in organizing the final year students.

## 4. End Semester Examination Results
