- 3 The committee recorded the minutes of the previous Governing Body meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 2018 and the action taken based on the suggestions given in the meeting. The minutes and the action taken were approved.
- 4 The Chairperson requested the principal to present a report on the activities in the college from the last Governing Body meeting to till date.
- 5 The Principal presented the report and the highlights as follows
  - a. The present strength of the college is 8223 and the faculty strength is 282.
  - b. During the academic year 2018-19, 1409 students got placed in various multinational and National level companies with a total offer of 2066. The highest salary being 4.5 lakhs per annum and a average salary is 2.6 lakhs per annum.
  - c. During the academic year 2019-20 to till date, 38 companies visited the college for placement and 700 offers have been received by the students. The highest salary being 5.16 lakhs per annum.
  - d. The Principal announced that the college has improved its National ranking during the year 2018-19 both in NIRF and in Media.

The College offers progressive education to the students in a holistic manner. The College which began with the strength of 17 students in 1997, has seen a steady growth of students' strength over the years and now it has more than 8223 students, pursuing 34 UG Programmes, 14 PG Programmes, one Integrated Programme and 7 Research Programmes. Sri Krishna Arts and Science College is in the continuous pursuit of increasing its quality and has scaled greater heights in this regard. It was accredited with 'A' Grade by NAAC in the year 2009 and subsequently re-accredited with a high score of 3.26 CGPA, 'A' Grade, in the year 2015 - 2016. As education is a continuous process and knowledge is infinite, our Institution encourages research in order to expand the comprehensive wisdom of students and faculty members. 


#### 2.8 Institution Innovation Cell (IIC)



This examination is guite tough to clear as it has negative markings. This certificate is highly recognized and valued as a core qualification for anyone who seeks a career in Capital Market. This exam is made mandatory by SEBI for those who aspire to work in the derivative segment of the capital market. The students were trained by Dr. P. Radhakrishnan (HOD - Commerce BPS & CM) who had earlier cleared the exam with 95%.

## 11. COVID-19 Pandemic Scenario

The COVID-19 pandemic has created the largest disruption of education systems in history, affecting nearly 1.6 billion learners in more than 190 countries and all continents. Closures of schools and other learning spaces have impacted 94 per cent of the world's student population, up to 99 per cent in low and lower-middle income countries. The COVID-19 crisis and the unparalleled education disruption is far from over. As many as 100 countries have yet to announce a date for schools to reopen and across the world, governments, unions, parents and children are grappling with when and how to approach the next phase.

Strengthening the resilience of education systems through online mode enabled students of SKASC to margue the persistent tutoring and accomplishment of their studies. SKASC has promoted e-learning through platforms such as Google Classroom, Myklassroom, Youtube and WhatsApp to the Digital Generation adults of India. The Faculty blended the class with a power-point, an animation video with the Faculty Voiceover for easy understanding. Addition to this the students are evaluated daily and also weekend assignments are given for continuous learning.

#### 11.1 Teaching Learning – Google Classroom

1492 Google classrooms were created by Teachers for the subjects. A special SoP was formulated by SKASC to implement teaching learning through Google classroom during this period of uncertainty because of COVID-19 Pandemic.



#### 11.1.1 Compulsory Contents of one Lecture

- A PowerPoint presentation on the topic with higher order conceptual thinking.
- A video recording of the faculty explains the concept along with the amalgamation of an expert's video on the same topic.
- A lecture material in the form of word document for the student reference.
- An animation video as a self explanatory module for better understanding.
- Multiple choice questions with higher order thinking on the topic thought to check their level understanding.
- Online Compilers, Spreadsheets, Case studies, Quiz, etc., for analysis and interpretations.
- Questions for Competitive exams such as UPSC, TOFEL, ILET, GMATE, GATE were included.

#### 11.1.2 Content Review


The content prepared by the faculty following the above SoP was subjected to four levels of review. HOD, Principal, CEO and Managing Trustee conducts review of the content, teaching methodology and also monitors the actual class room teaching.

#### 11.2 Evaluation

Online examination system provides a comprehensive report system that is highly accurate and instant to the students. Physical written answer sheet is scanned and uploaded to a cloud based software system. Digital evaluation tools like digital annotations, assigning marks, total calculation, moderation Onscreen Marking System is useful to evaluate physical copies of the answer sheets in digital format. The Project Viva-Voce Examinations, practical were conducted online through the existing infrastructure like Google Meet, Zoom, Cisco meet etc. It was indeed a challenging task for both the students and the invigilators; they took it up cheerfully and succeeded in it. The exams were conducted in the same way as offline exams. SKASC conducted ICIA test from 28.09.2020 for the II, III and PG students. SKASC has been successfully overcoming these hurdles through regular online classes and it has taken a step further in organizing the final year students.'

#### 11.3 Examination – Proctored Mode

Proctored exams are timed exams; this semester our college have taken proctored exams. Proctored examinations using a software to monitor the students' suspicious activities during examinations. A Computer desktop, webcam video and audio. along with this we have used invigilator to facilitate and monitor the students. The data recorded by the software is transferred to proctoring service for review.



#### 11.4 Features of Proctored Mode Examinations

- Unauthorized person sitting near the computer doing prompting.
- Impersonation of authorized student camera view.
- Tab Switching and copying.
- Unnecessary movements noted by the software while examination is ON.
- No proper dress code while writing the examination.
- Hall Ticket and ID card with lanyard not hanging on the neck.
- Students not present before sometime in the middle of the examination.
- Switching of answer sheets which somebody is writing and giving it at the end of the examination.
- Any other noted deviations.

#### 11.5 Academic Governance

To enrich the existing curriculum to meet the Industry need, SKASC keeps in mind to conduct academic governance in the allotted time slots. The Pandemic has not hindered our progress. Department meeting, Curriculum Development Cell, Board of Studies, Academic Council Meeting were conducted in the online mode. Stake holders, Industrial Experts, Alumni, Academicians and members were joint in the right spirit.

# 11.6 Faculty Headway

The Faculty of SKASC have also been regularly attending webinars by various subject experts as well as online courses conducted by top academic Institutions in various fields of study through online learning platforms to enlighten their students with updated knowledge. These sessions have helped the students to build a clearer base of knowledge and helped them to aim towards high quality of research.

# 12. Teaching and Learning

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College fully understands that technology is an integral part of higher education and hence it provides opportunities to the students for online learning and utilizes up to date modern learning technologies. These effective uses of learning technologies have ensured highly modern learning and teaching practices followed in the Institution. All the classrooms of the College are smart classrooms with Active smart boards and LCD projectors and the members of the faculty use digital platforms to handle their classes.

# 12.1 GoogleClassroom

Google Classroom is a web service developed by Google for Educational Institutions that aim to simplify creating, distributing and grading assignments in a paperless way. The primary purpose of Google Classroom is to streamline the process of sharing files between teachers and students. It combines Google Drive for assignment creation and distribution, Google Docs, Sheets and Slides for writing, Gmail for communication, and Google Calendar for scheduling. Sri Krishna College of Arts and Science is one of the most effective users of Google Classroom. The Students of our college are invited to join Google class through a private code. Each class creates a separate folder in the respective user's Drive, where the student submits work to be graded by a teacher. Mobile apps, available for iOS and Android devices which let the students to take photos and attach assignments, share files from other apps, and access information offline. Teachers can monitor the progress for each student, and after grading, teachers can return the student's work, along with comments.

#### 12.2 Myklassroom


Sri Krishna Arts and Science College also uses another digital platform in addition to Google Classroom called as Myklassroom. It is a powerful blend of Social networking and E-learning. It provides an online collaborative platform for teaching and learning. It facilitates the next generation classroom, which would provide structured access to information, a forum to discuss and assimilate information, online lectures, a faculty to moderate discussions, and 24/7 access to classrooms anywhere anytime. All this is because we believe that "A classroom is much more than just a blackboard." And it has brought the real classroom experience online. #### 12.3 Choice Based Credit System

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been introduced by SKASC that provides a special platform to choose the courses based upon the individual interests of the students. The CBCS system is an updated version which motivates teamwork, innovative thinking and mastery in different fields and so on.


#### 12.4 Outcome-Based Education



# 13. Evaluation

#### 13. 1 OMR Score Card

The Outcome Based Education is implemented by defining the Bloom's Taxonomy verbs and Course Outcomes mapped in the syllabi of each course. Then the question papers are set with Bloom's taxonomy verbs mapped for each question. During answer scripts evaluation, OMR score cards for individual students are given to the evaluators, and the evaluators shade the marks that the student receives for each question. It helps in the analysis of student's performance for each skill and facilitates us to provide each student with the OBE Assessment card.




#### 13. 2 OBE Assessment Card- Skill Set Mapping

Apart from the regular mark sheet, the students are provided with OBE Assessment sheets that pictorially present the student's proficiency in specified knowledge levels and skill sets. The skills that are mapped are Competitive, Conceptual, Communication, Managerial and Technical skills. The skill sets of the students are mapped based on their scores in exams and presented on the Assessment sheet. It equips the students to understand their skills better and to choose a job that aligns with their skills. 
## 13.3 Online Continuous Internal Assessment







#### 17.1.1 Faculty and Staff Exchange

Exchange of faculty to engage in teaching, research and/or study at each other's Institutions will be encouraged. The number and conditions of such exchanges, including exchange or visit period, Institutional obligations, and related matters shall be mutually agreed upon in written implementing agreements to be concluded between the two Institutions.

# 17.1.2 Student Exchange

Attendance of students (undergraduate and graduate) from one Institution to the other is encouraged. Each student must, however, meet the admission requirements of the departments or programs to which he/she applies. The number and conditions of such exchanges, including exchange or visit length, Institutional obligations, and related matters shall be mutually agreed upon in written implementing agreements to be concluded between the two Institutions.

#### 17.1.3 Special Training and Degree Programs

Joint teaching programs, collaborative degree programs, and other special partnership programs between the Institutions will be considered. Each Institution understands and accepts that joint curriculum development and potential collaborative degree programs require significant efforts – study, review, coordination, and involvement of many administrators and faculty within and outside their respective Institutions; nevertheless, each Institution will seek to advance cooperation through the development of such special programs. It is hereby agreed to initiate the academic collaboration through an articulated undergraduate BBA program and an articulated integrated graduate MBA program.

# 17.1.4 Research and Knowledge Transfer

Faculty members from the two Institutions would work towards identifying possible areas of conducting joint cross-cultural research and writing business case studies with a view to understand markets, organizations and consumers in the two countries better.

### 17.2 Concordia College, New York

## 17.2.1 American Transfer Program (ATP) "Two Plus One"

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College students can participate in the American Transfer Program (ATP), which is a unique offering by Concordia College, New York to a select group of Indian Institutions. Sri Krishna Arts and Science College students can enter ATP after having completed FOUR semesters. Students will begin their course of study in their first or second semester, or in the summer following their second semester, at SKASC, and generally be able to complete their American Baccalaureate Degree through two additional semesters of study at Concordia College, New York.

# 17.2.2 Graduate Studies Programs (2+2)

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College students intending to continue at Concordia to earn a Master's Degree in Business Leadership, Digital Media, or Analytics, may be eligible to begin graduate coursework during their third year of study while at Concordia College New York.

#### 17.2.3 Student and Faculty Exchange Programme:

Concordia College and Sri Krishna Arts and Science College, will also actively plan and implement faculty and student exchange program between the two Institutions.

#### 17.2.4 Collaborative Research Activities

Faculty of Concordia and SKASC will be doing joint research in each semester in the field of Management, English, Computer Science and Bio Technology and the research paper will be published in International Journals.

#### 17.2.5 Faculty Development Programme

Faculty Development Programmes will be conducted for SKASC faculty members in alliance with Concordia College during July – August every year. 
# 18. Globalization at SKASC effect from 2021-22

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College always keeps pace with the globalization of higher education. The CEO, Principal and Senior faculty members visited universities in the USA such as Harvard University, Columbia University, Marshal State University, Texas A & M University and Clayton State University. After extensive discussion with the President and Vice Chancellors (Provost) of various universities, the College has drawn up the following foreign collaborations for the year 2020–21.

- 1. From the Academic Year 2020 2021, one compulsory 2 credit course will be taught by the faculty from Concordia College, New York during the month of July 2020. At the end of the course, a course completion certificate will be given by the Concordia College. New York. SKASC will assign 2 additional credits in the transcript of the 3rd semester.
- 2. Classes on Intellectual Property Rights by the Texas A&M University, Dallas (89th ranking university in the USA with a student population of 52,000) will be taught for our Post Graduate Students from the Academic Year 2020-2021. On Successful completion of the course, students will be awarded 2 additional credits.
- 3. The College has also finalized study abroad programme in the Clayton State University, Atlanta by Georgia State, wherein a student can study a full Semester programme (5th Semester) or a half-semester (40 days) as a part of their IET programmes.
- 4. The College has also worked on American Transfer Programme, with 3 universities in the USA (Clayton State University, Concordia College and Marshal State University) for 2+2 transfer programme. The programme would help the students to study for 2 years in India and study 2 years in the USA and get a full American Under-Graduate degree.
- 5. Arrangements are underway to offer 10 online courses each from Concordia College, New York and Clayton State University, Atlanta to the students of SKASC from the year 2020-21.
- 6. Sri Krishna Arts and Science is in the pipeline to establish the Collaboration with US Universities for the English Literature, Computer Science and Psychology as 2+2 exchange programmes.



Ponnuchamy, assistant professor at the Department of Psychiatric Social Work, National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru said here.

He was addressing a workshop on 'Preventing Suicide Tendency and Counselling Technique' organised by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Suicide Prevention cell of Post Graduate Department of Social Work of Sri Krishna Arts and Science College (SKASC) on Saturday.

"Suicide is the second largest cause for the death of youth and India has one of the largest suicide rates between the ages 15 and 29. Every two hours and 11 minutes, a person under the age of 25 dies attempting suicide. One in seven high school students have considered attempting suicide.

considered attempting sui-cide. Every hour, one stu-dent commits suicide and every three seconds one



teen attempts suicide in India. In 2015, the number of reported cases of students committing suicide stood at 8,924." he said. Research studies bring to light that most adolescent suicides occur after school. suicides occur after school hours and in the teen's

that Stating Stating that mental health care needs more attention in India, the pro-fessor told the workshop that India spends less than Bangladesh on mental health services. "Academic neath services. "Academic institutions must create awareness about drug abuse and suicide. Drug abuse is one the major cause for suicide among youth." he said.
