




The Committee recorded his leave of absence.

- The Committee recorded the minutes of the previous Governing Body meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> April 2022 and the action taken based on the suggestions given in the meeting. The minutes and the action taken were approved.
- Appointment of Principal for Sri Krishna Arts and Science College.
- The Chairperson and Managing Trustee Mrs. S. Malarvizhi informed the members the need to appoint a Principal in lieu of the vacancy that arose as Dr. P. Baby Shakila resigned. Applications were called from qualified candidates. A Selection committee was formed to select the Principal. The selection committee considering the qualification, eligibility and experience recommended Dr. R.Jagajeevan B.Com., MBA., M.Phil., Ph.D for the post of Principal. Mr. JayaKumar Ramdass moved that Dr. R.Jagajeevan B.Com., MBA., M.Phil., Ph.D. be appointed as Principal. This was seconded by Dr. K. Sundararaman.
- The Chairperson requested the principal to present a report on the activities in the college from the last Governing Body meeting till date.
- The Principal presented the report and the highlights are as follows
  - a. The present student strength of the college is 8358.
  - b. The present faculty strength of the college is 277 with 104 Ph.D holders, 23 NET cleared, 24 SET cleared and 177 M.Phil. holders.

  - B.Sc. Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning



## 1.Awards and Accreditation

### 1.1 NIRF Ranking

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) by the Ministry of Education (MoE) outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. **NIRF** has ranked SKASC at **33<sup>rd</sup>** position among all the other Arts and Science Colleges across India for the year 2022. ## 1.2 Institution Innovation Cell (IIC)

#### **Stage 1 Stakeholder and Benchmarking Report**

Once the need and market analysis of the programme has been reported through adequate stakeholder analysis, the next step is to determine the Programme Educational Objectives.

#### **Stage 2 Programme Educational Objectives**

The Programme Educational Objectives should be determined based on the mission and vision statement of the Institution. There can be 3-5 Programme Educational Objectives for a Programme. Broad statements that describe the

student's career and professional accomplishments within 5 years upon graduation. These are the statements that describe what the students are expected to know or be able to do by the time they complete an academic degree-qualification. The programme educational objectives are different from the students' learning outcomes in four ways, 1.Degree of specificity 2. Role of constituents Purpose of assessment 4. Cycles of data collection. Once the Programme

Educational Objectives should be mapped against the mission and vision of the Institution.

### **Stage 3 Programme Learning Outcomes**

The programme learning outcomes should be determined based on the graduate attributes or the skills. These Programme Learning Outcomes should be mapped against the Programme Educational Objectives and the blooms taxonomy of verbs. The abilities (Cognitive, Psychomotor and Affective) that a student should be able to demonstrate at the time of graduation. Therefore, Programme learning outcomes are a description of knowledge, competencies, and values a student display at the time of completion of graduation.

### **5.3 The Three Domains of Learning**

The Three domains of learning are 1.Cognitive (thinking from the head) 2.Affective domain (executing from heart) 3.Psychomotor (the movements of hands and legs)

- a. Cognitive: This is a mental process involved in thinking, gaining knowledge and comprehension. There are six categories and levels under Cognitive domain.
  - *C1-Remembering*
  - *C2-Understanding*
  - *C3-Appling*
  - *C4-Analysing*
  - *C5-Evaluating*
  - *C6- Creating*

- b. The affective domain includes the manner in which we deal things emotionally, such as feelings, enthusiasm, motivation, values, appreciation, attitudes etc., There are five levels of learning under this domain
- *A1-Receiving Phenomena*
  - *A2-Responding to Phenomena*
  - *A3-Valuing*
  - *A4-Organisation*
  - *A5-Internalising value*
- c. Psychomotor Domain: the psychomotor domain includes physical movement, coordination and use of motor skill areas. Development of these skills requires practice and it is measured in terms of speed, precision, distance, procedures, or techniques in execution. There are seven levels of learning.
- *P1-Perception (awareness)*
  - *P2-Set*
  - *P3-Guided response*
  - *P4-Mechanism*
  - *P5-Complex Overt Response*
  - *P6-Adaptation*
  - *P7-Origination*

#### **Stage 4 Course Learning Outcomes**

Depending upon the graduate attributes and the mapping of Programme Learning Outcomes, the Course Learning Outcomes will be framed. The Course Learning outcome should definitely follow the Blooms Taxonomy of verbs. Specific statements of what the students are expected to achieve at the end of the course. These statements are central to course curriculum which is measurable, observable and clearly indicates what a student should know and be able to do as a result of learning. The course learning outcome should satisfy the following condition.

- Each course will address three to four CLO statements
- Should be mapped to the learning domains of Blooms or other Taxonomy of verbs

- There should be one to one mapping with the CLO and PLO statement. i.e one CLO should be mapped with one PLO
- Expressed in terms of measurable and achievable
- There should be an action Verb + Standard or Verb + Condition or Verb + Standard+ Condition.
- Multiple PLO, CLO and taxonomy of verbs should not be reflected in a single CLO statement.

### **Stage 5 Constructive Alignment of teaching methodologies and Assessment**

There should be constructive alignment of teaching methodologies and assessment procedure. The assessment should be evaluated through Rubrics and appropriate marking scheme should be provided.

### **Stage 6 Curriculum Documentation**

After the fixation of students learning time and the credit fixation. The final curriculum should be documented and approved by the Academic council.

### **Stage 7 Implementation with evidences**

The Curriculum document should be appropriately documented and relevant evidences on the methodology of learning and assessment procedures need to be recorded. Relevant evidences pertaining to Lesson Plan, Course plan, Test Blue print, Assessment Rubrics and evaluation, should be classified in accordance with the Level of Blooms.

### **Stage 8 Evaluation**

The attainment of the students collectively for a module as well as individual attainment should be recorded and presented through a report. This report should be presented in the Annual Programme Monitoring Report as well as in Module Monitoring Report. This will provide an insight to the institution in closing the gap in the curriculum. The gaps will be informed to the curriculum review committee and the process will continue further.

## 6. Teaching and Learning

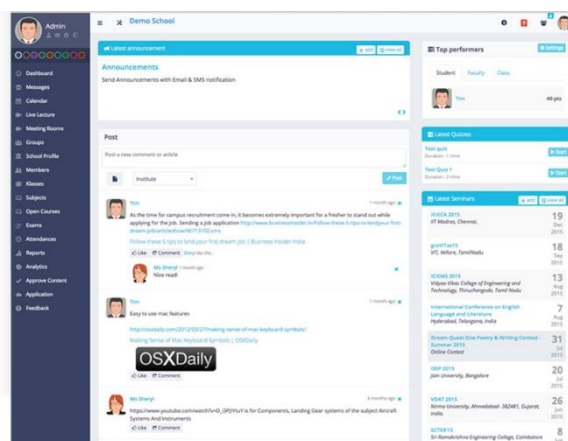

SKASC is moving in leaps and bounds with regard to technology and learning by being the first among major higher educational institutions to introduce and integrate advanced technology in student-centric arenas.

## 6.2 MyKlassroom

MyKlassroom is a powerful blend of social networking and E-learning, which provides an online collaborative platform for the benefit of both students and teachers. MyKlassroom is the future of the next generation classroom providing structured access to information, a forum for moderating. A round the clock access to





classroom and study material anywhere and anytime makes this one of the most effective and accessible modes of learning. Test marks and attendance is posted in the platform making it an inevitable part of both teaching and practical purposes. Maximum postings by students and faculty garner maximum points which is recognized and appreciated by the management. Faculty profile, detailed syllabus and mapping of components is maintained in MyKlassroom making it a specialized online classroom as well as repository of data.

### 6.3 Choice Based Credit System



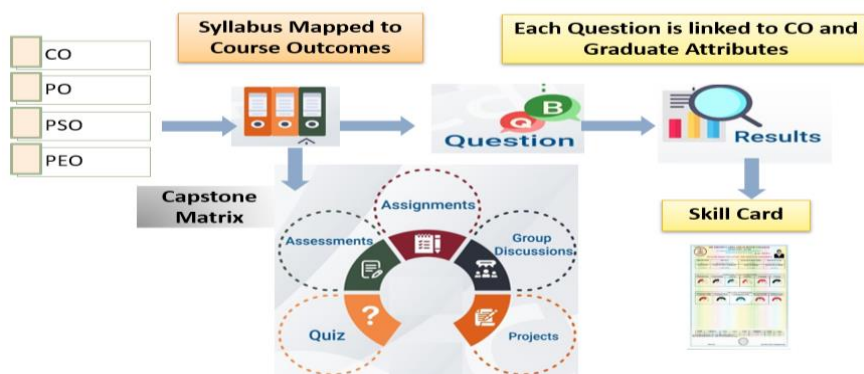

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College follows CBCS pattern meticulously, offering various courses to the students such as Specific Elective Courses, Discipline Specific Courses and Value added courses.

### 6.4 Evaluation

SKASC follows the continuous system of evaluation with the End Semester exam culminating the evaluation process for that particular semester. Evaluation is a constant and continuous process in Education and it is a



challenging phase in this pandemic. The teaching and learning have under gone a lot of changes from the syllabi to content delivery. The lesson plan for online classes has modified from the regular lesson plan hence every step and aspect of evaluation also customized.



The continuous system of evaluation along with the other assessment techniques like presentations, poster presentations, quiz, Group Assignment, portfolios and many others encourage the students to display an all round development not only in their test but also co-curricular activities. Self learning focusing on study and research is encouraged and it gives the students an option to explore other avenues of their multi-faceted personalities.

## 6.5 Coursera Enterprise Campus Plan

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College has initiated “Coursera Enterprise Campus Plan” was initiated in the month of March 2022, enrolling First year students. A Total of 1025 students and 100 faculty (Faculty up skilling programme) enrolled in the second batch of Science and Arts streams. 16,515 enrollments and 33,361 completions were evidenced in the analytics of Coursera. In the Skill Domain Completion category, majority (36.28%) of the courses were from Computer Science Domain and the rest is as follows. The learner Proficiency by Top Skill includes Data Analysis with the 1396 learners and 183 learners at the Intermediate level of skills in Data Analysis, 8 at advanced level, 604 at beginner’s level and 601 at Conversant level. All these learners surprising elements was choosing Business Data Analysis.

Java Class Library and Excel Skills for Business: Essentials has been listed as top courses chosen by Science stream students. The Average learning hours was 8 hours for Statistical Programming and the lowest was Human Resources with 1 hour.

Faculty up skilling courses was introduced under the “Coursera Enterprise Campus Plan”, 50% of the Faculty has completed more than 4+ courses. Sri Krishna Arts and Science College is the proud recipient of “Rising Star 2022”. The award was received by the CEO of Sri Krishna Institutions at the Coursera summit New Delhi on 12th October 2022.

## 7. End Semester Examinations Results

The Controller of Examinations board focuses on Syllabus Framing, Question Paper Settings, Scheduling the Laboratory and Theory Examinations, Planning for External Lab Examiners, conducting the End Semester Examinations, Evaluating the Answer Scripts, Announcing the Result, Fixing the Transparency date, Issuing the Marksheetworks, conducting Additional Credit Course Examinations, Collecting NPTEL certificates of the students and printing them in the Marksheetworks, and other exam related procedures. Dr. B. Meena Preethi is the CoE, who administers the section vibrantly. The pass percentage of the students every year is considerable and getting increased. The pass percentage of UG 2020-2023 batches (31 departments) is 85.63, and PG batches (13 departments) is 90.60. A total of 2179 students appeared for the examinations out of which 1866 cleared the papers from the UG batches. From PG batches, out of 511 students 463 cleared the examinations.

## 9. Research

Since the research is an inevitable part of any institution, SKASC provides a perfect platform for researchers by providing seed money, concession in research fee, financial aid for publication, fund for participating in conferences, etc., Notable research conducted at SKASC provides a chance to take up ground-breaking research that aims to address problems in the real world. We have partnered with several NGOs and industrial sectors, and we look forward to more of these kinds of engagements.

The well augmented research culture in SKASC brought notable publications and research grants to the institution. Proving that, recently five research projects were sanctioned from Tamil Nadu State Council for Science Technology, Chennai under the Students Project Scheme (SPS). Also, several research projects were applied funding agencies by our faculty members to conduct core research in their respective discipline.

Prior to starting their coordinated dissertations and seminar papers, the Research Scholars at SKASC take extensive training on research methodology. Renowned research training sessions are available for M.Phil. and Ph.D. scholars. Currently, 103 students are pursuing Ph.D and scholars collaborated with faculty members on both small-scale and large-scale research initiatives. Dr. Maria Williams serves as the SKASC Research Cell's coordinator.

Apart from M.Phil. and Ph.D. scholars who are tirelessly working to achieve their goals, postgraduate as well as undergraduate students are also encouraged to involve themselves in research activities. Group and individual projects have been made mandatory to secure a degree that strongly inculcates a research culture among young minds. Capstone projects are instituted as part of the curriculum for undergraduate students, in which the students work toward product development and patenting.

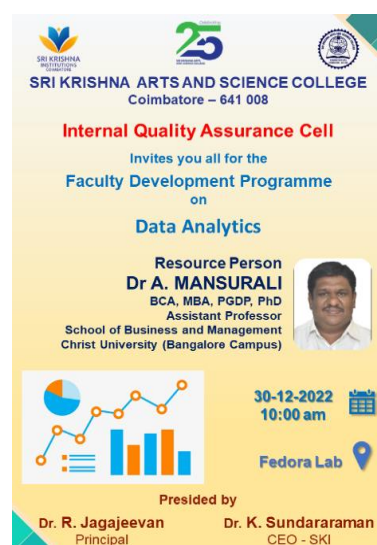

technologies. He gave a lecture on the various sources of data, internal data analytic process, the potential challenges that data fusion may face in the future, and the technologies that are currently in use.



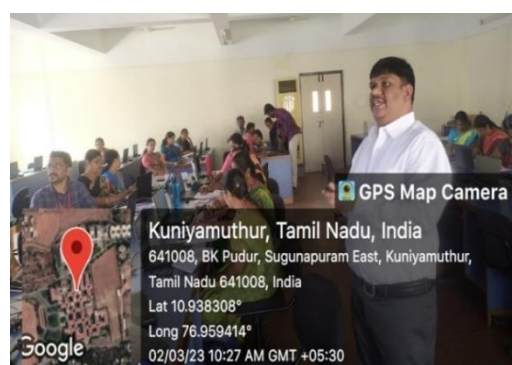
## FDP on Data Analytics II

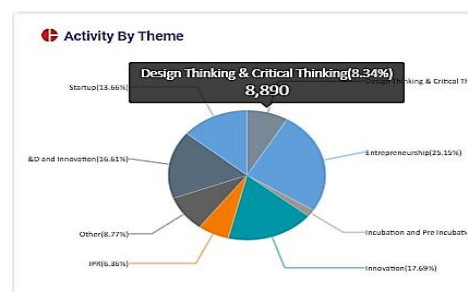

## **14. Student Support System**

### **14.1 Student Induction Programme (SIP)**

An important task, therefore, is to welcome new students to Higher Education and prepare them for their new role. Student Induction is designed to help in the whole process. Therefore, it should be taken seriously, and as something more than the mere orientation programme. The Programme is scheduled for 30 Hours covering the following:

12. 1 Hour Session on Placement

### **14.2 Academic Review Meeting (ARM)**

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College has planned to conduct an Academic Review Meeting for the parents of our students on 29th October 2022 between 10 am and 1 pm. ARM provides an opportunity to refine students' individual learning plans and to make sure the roles of teachers, students and parents. ARM helps to bridge the communication between parents and the college. The common agenda of I CIA test performance, attendance, certificate MOOC (NPTEL & Coursera), discipline issues (If any) procedure for End Semester Examination to be discussed with the parents along with students' individual learning process.

### **14.3 Tutor-Ward System**

Tutor- Ward system enriches the teaching-learning process by focusing on smaller groups and catering to the individual needs of the students. The Tutor-Ward system implemented on campus strengthens the tutor's understanding of their ward's individual talent and assists the student in demonstrating competence confidently.

Tutor ward sessions are conducted once in every 15 days for the students to share their experiences or difficulties faced in the process of learning and teaching. Tutors advise the students on regular attendance and review their performance in CIA tests. Based on the academic performance and attendance, students were given proper counselling. Remedial classes are arranged for the slow learners. The minutes of the Tutor-ward meeting is recorded and reviewed by the HOD in the department meeting along with the faculty members. Suitable action will be initiated for the development of the students. Actions required at the college level will be placed in the HODs meeting, and if required, the Principal will take the necessary actions. A tutor is followed for each student on the basis of 1:30 ratio.

### **14.4 Class Committee Meeting**

The college organizes class committee meetings to improve academic performance and resolve student grievances. The class committee meeting, convened twice in a semester, serves as a platform for the students to give their suggestions on the teaching-learning process and in curriculum revision, syllabus coverage, feedback about the faculty teaching and express their grievances, if any. A team of eight students, comprised of two fast learners, two moderate learners, two slow learners, and two class representatives, is formed. The meeting will be chaired by the respective head of the department, and senior members of the teaching staff will be attending the meeting to discuss the possible improvements that can be made during the semester. The meeting's outcome is presented to the Principal, and any necessary action is taken at the heads meeting.

### **14.5 Student Council**

The college has an active student's council to represent the academic and co-curricular activities of the college. The principal of the college is the Chairman of the Students Council. All the class representatives are the members of the student's council. The members of the student's council are selected on the basis of merit, i.e.

one topper from each class. To promote opportunities for the development of character, leadership, efficiency, knowledge and spirit of service among students.

#### **14.6 Suicide Prevention Cell**

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College opened a Suicide Prevention Cell in the college premises. Intervention can prevent suicide and this cell ensures to prevent suicide because life is beautiful and it should not be wasted for trivial reasons. We believe that suicide is not inevitable. When we talk, and allow others to share with us, we provide hope and support to people in pain. We can help prevent suicide.

#### **14.7 Anti-Ragging Committee**

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College is a ragging free campus and due to continuous vigil by the faculty members and cooperation of the students there is no single incidence related to ragging incidence in this college. Anti-ragging Banners and posters are placed in Administrative Building, Academic Building and Student hostels along with WhatsApp numbers of the authorities and complaint boxes.

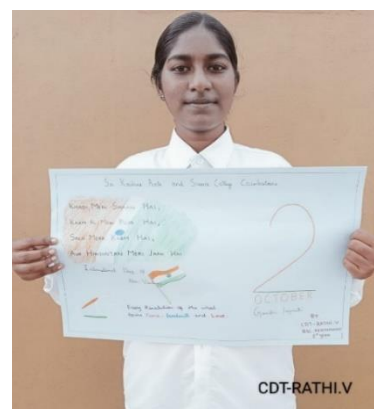
**Name of the Activity: Gandhi Jayanthi**

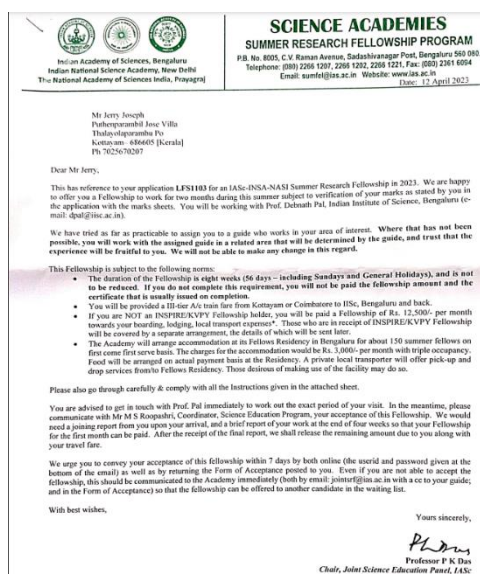

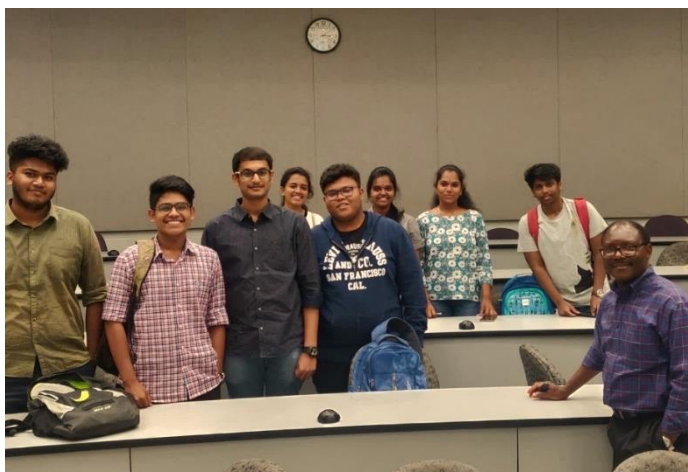
## 20. International Collaborations

The college has stepped into worldwide collaborations by penning (MoUs) Memorandums of Understanding with the best universities across the globe to provide students with unparalleled opportunities to explore international educational experiences. The following are the universities with which the MoUs are signed.

1. Clayton State University, Atlanta, USA
2. Texas A & M University, Dallas, USA
3. Avila University, USA

### 20.1 Clayton State University Atlanta, USA

As part of the ambitious plan to globalize and offer an international exposure to the students, Sri Krishna Arts and Science College (SKASC) has partnered with Clayton State University, Atlanta, USA and signed an MOU for International collaboration. Clayton State University (CSU) is a public university and serves the Metro Atlanta and is a selective Senior Unit of the University System of Georgia. The purpose of MoU is to enhance cooperative relationship between the two universities and to develop academics and cultural exchange in the area of education, research and other academic activities. The agreement facilitates transfer of SKASC students to Clayton University at the end of the second year after completing the required number of credits under 2+2 twinning programme.



The CSU will accept the credits earned by the students at SKASC and admit the students in their university for BBA under graduate programme. Totally 11 students of SKASC have been successfully transferred to Clayton and go the BBA degree from CSU.

Attendance of the students is mandatory and most importantly the students must meet the admission requirements of the departments or programs to which they apply.



## 20.2 Texas A & M University, Dallas

A&M-Commerce at Dallas partners with SKASC to provide exciting internships and career opportunities that can give students an edge in the job market. MIB Intellectual Property Rights is basically a 2-years postgraduate programme on Human Rights discipline. This course imparts advanced awareness and skills that are useful for managing the owner's artistic, intellectual, academic inventions. As a part of the MoU, SKASC students can pursue a course in **Intellectual Property Rights** at **Texas A & M University, Dallas**.





### 20.3 Avila University, USA

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College (SKASC) and Avila University in Kansas City, Missouri, USA are set to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that will provide several benefits to students and faculty at both institutions. The MOU will cover a range of initiatives, including the 2+1 and 2+2 twinning programmes, student and faculty exchanges, dual degree programmes, summer visit, and joint academic conferences. Under the 2+1 and 2+2 degree programmes, students at SKASC can transfer to Avila University to complete their degree programmes, with credits earned at SKASC being recognized by Avila. The student and faculty exchange program will allow students and faculty members from both institutions to visit each other's campuses, attend lectures, and collaborate on research projects. 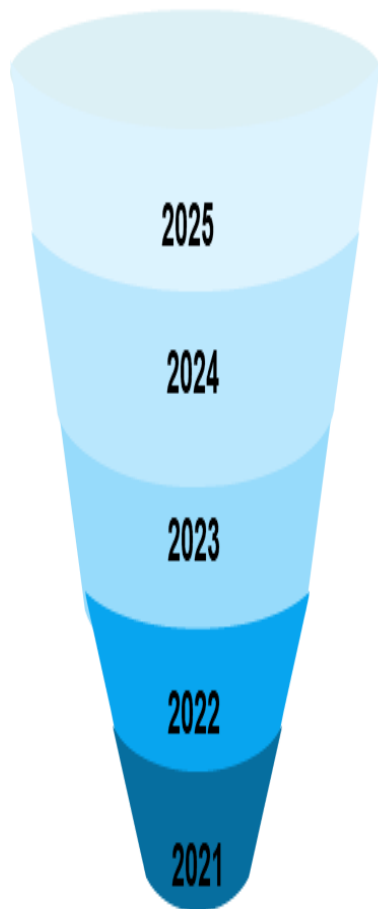
## 23. Alumni Meet

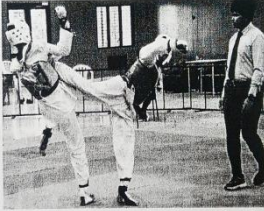
