#### **5. Curriculum Enrichment**

#### 5.1 Outcome Based Education

Outcome Based Education is a transformation of "teacher centric" to "student centric". OBE focusses on what students can actually do after they are taught and expect all learners to achieve particular level of knowledge and abilities. OBE is a revolution from memorizing facts to application in a situation.

#### Requisites of LOCF Framework based on OBE

- Learning process need to be clearly identified
- Students' progress is based on the demonstrated achievement
- Multiple instructional and assessment strategies need to be available in order to meet the demands and needs of the student
- Adequate time and assistance need to be provided to make the student realize full potential.

#### Benefits of LOCF Framework based on OBE

- More directed and coherent curriculum structure
- Industry relevant Graduates
- Continuous Quality Improvement as an inevitable process Therefore, OBE can be achieved through the learning outcomes.

#### Regulations in drafting OBE in Curriculum

#### Stage 1 Stakeholder and Benchmarking Report

Once the need and market analysis of the programme has been reported through adequate stakeholder analysis, the next step is to determine the Programme Educational Objectives.

#### Stage 2 Programme Educational Objectives

The Programme Educational Objectives should be determined based on the mission and vision statement of the Institution. There can be 3-5 Programme Educational Objectives for a Programme. Broad statements that describe the student's career and professional accomplishments within 5 years upon graduation. These are the statements that describe what the students are expected to know or be able to do by the time they complete an academic degree-qualification. The programme

educational objectives are different from the students' learning outcomes in four ways, 1.Degree of specificity 2. Role of constituents Purpose of assessment 4. Cycles of data collection. Once the Programme Educational Objectives should be mapped against the mission and vision of the Institution.

#### **Stage 3 Programme Learning Outcomes**

The programme learning outcomes should be determined based on the graduate attributes or the skills. These Programme Learning Outcomes should be mapped against the Programme Educational Objectives and the blooms taxonomy of verbs. The abilities (Cognitive, Psychomotor and Affective) that a student should be able to demonstrate at the time of graduation. Therefore, Programme learning outcomes are a description of knowledge, competencies, and values a student display at the time of completion of graduation.

#### The Three Domains of Learning

The Three domains of learning are 1.Cognitive (thinking from the head) 2.Affective domain (executing from heart) 3.Psychomotor (the movements of hands and legs)

- a. Cognitive: This is a mental process involved in thinking, gaining knowledge and comprehension. There are six categories and levels under Cognitive domain.
  - C1-Remembering
  - C2-Understanding
  - C3-Applying
  - C4-Analysing
  - C5-Evaluating
  - C6- Creating
- b. The affective domain includes the manner in which we deal things emotionally, such as feelings, enthusiasm, motivation, values, appreciation, attitudes etc., There are five levels of learning under this domain
  - A1-Receiving Phenomena
  - A2-Responding to Phenomena
  - A3-Valuing
  - A4-Organisation

#### • A5-Internalising value

- c. Psychomotor Domain: the psychomotor domain includes physical movement, coordination and use of motor skill areas. Development of these sills requires practice and it is measured in terms of speed, precision, distance, procedures, or techniques in execution. There are seven levels of learning.
  - P1-Perception (awareness)
  - P2-Set
  - P3-Guided response
  - P4-Mechanism
  - P5-Complex Overt Response
  - P6-Adaptation
  - P7-Origination

#### Stage 4 Course Learning Outcomes

Depending upon the graduate attributes and the mapping of Programme Learning Outcomes, the Course Learning Outcomes will be framed. The Course Learning outcome should definitely follow the Blooms Taxonomy of verbs. Specific statements of what the students are expected to achieve at the end of the course. These statements are central to course curriculum which is measurable, observable and clearly indicates what a student should know and be able to do as a result of learning. The course learning outcome should satisfy the following condition.

- Each course will address three to four CLO statements
- Should be mapped to the learning domains of Blooms or other Taxonomy of verbs
- There should be one to one mapping with the CLO and PLO statement. i.e oneCLO should be mapped with one PLO
- Expressed in terms of measurable and achievable
- There should be an action Verb + Standard or Verb + Condition or Verb + Standard+ Condition.
- Multiple PLO, CLO and taxonomy of verbs should not be reflected in a

singleCLO statement.

## Stage 5 Constructive Alignment of teaching methodologies and Assessment

There should be constructive alignment of teaching methodologies and assessment procedure. The assessment should be evaluated through Rubrics and appropriate marking scheme should be provided.

#### Stage 6 Curriculum Documentation

After the fixation of students learning time and the credit fixation. The final curriculum should be documented and approved by the Academic council.

#### Stage 7 Implementation with evidences

The Curriculum document should be appropriately documented and relevant evidences on the methodology of learning and assessment procedures need to be recorded. Relevant evidences pertaining to Lesson Plan, Course plan, Test Blue print, Assessment Rubrics and evaluation, should be classified in accordance with the Levelof Blooms.

#### Stage 8 Evaluation

The attainment of the students collectively for a module as well as individual attainment should be recorded and presented through a report. This report should be presented in the Annual Programme Monitoring Report as well as in Module MonitoringReport. This will provide an insight to the institution in closing the gap in the curriculum. The gaps will be informed to the curriculum review committee and the process will continue further.


#### Evaluation

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# 9. Research

The research cell seeks to improve academic and student research capacities. As it strives to acquire its vision and goal, the SKASC Research Cell makes a concerted effort to integrate its R&D efforts with technical competency and industry best practices. Faculty and student-led research focuses on the developing disciplines of science, business, and the arts. Notable research activities undertaken at SKASC give an opportunity to conduct ground-breaking research that strives to address real-world challenges. The institution has formed alliances with a number of non-governmental organizations and industrial sectors, and we anticipate more of these types of collaborations in the future. Faculty members are provided seed money, concession in research fee, financial aid for publication, fund for participating in conferences, etc.,

SKASC Research Scholars receive rigorous instruction in research methods before beginning their coordinated dissertations and seminar papers. M.Phil. and Ph.D. students can attend renowned research training courses. Currently, 16 students are seeking M.Phil. degrees, while 112 are pursuing Ph.D. degrees. Scholars and faculty members work together on both small and large-scale research projects. Dr. M. Manikandan is the coordinator of the SKASC Research Cell.

In addition to M.Phil. and Ph.D. researchers who work persistently to attain their objectives, postgraduate and undergraduate students are encouraged to participate in research activities. Individual and group projects have been made required for graduation, which firmly instils a research culture in young minds. Undergraduate students are introduced to capstone projects as part of the programme, in which they seek product creation and patenting.

SKASC has 68 guides recognized by Bharathiar University to supervise students towards their research degree. As we receive more applications for research degrees, we have a plan to increase the number of sanctioned strengths across various six disciplines, i.e., English, Commerce, Computer Science, Management Science, Electronics and Communication Systems, and Bioscience through which another 122 seats may be added. In addition to that, the department of Psychology will be upgraded to a research department after the due inspection by the committee set up by Bharathiar University.

Dr. M. Manikandan, Dean & Head, Department of Bioscience has served as "INSA Visiting Scientist" at Repository of Tomato Genomics Resources (RTGR), Department of Plant Sciences, School of Life Sciences, University of Hyderabad offered by the Indian National Science Academy (INSA),Department of Science and Technology(DST), Government of India from 10<sup>th</sup> July 2023 to 11<sup>th</sup> September 2023. The Visiting Scientist fellowship, conferred by DST-INSA, holds immense prestige within the scientific community. During his visit, he has worked on "Abiotic stress molecular response in Millet" and had a chance to experience the cutting-edge technologies in Plant molecular biology.





### 14. Student Support System

### 14.1 Student Induction Programme (SIP)

Transition from school to university-college life is one of the most challenging events in a student's life. An important task, therefore, is to welcome new students to Higher Education and prepare them for their new role. Student Induction is designed to help in the whole process. Therefore, it should be taken seriously, and as something more than the mere orientation programme.

### 14.2 Academic Review Meeting (ARM)

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College has planned to conduct an Academic Review Meeting for the parents of our students on 29th October 2022 between 10 amand 1 pm. ARM provides an opportunity to refine students' individual learning plans and to make sure the roles of teachers, students and parents. ARM helps to bridge thecommunication between parents and the college. The common agenda of I CIA test performance, attendance, certificate MOOC (NPTEL &; Coursera), discipline issues (Ifany) procedure for End Semester Examination to be discussed with the parents alongwith students' individual learning process.

### 14.3.Tutor-Ward System

Tutor- Ward system enriches the teaching-learning process by focusing on smaller groups and catering to the individual needs of the students. The Tutor-Ward system implemented on campus strengthens the tutor's understanding of their ward's individual talent and assists the student in demonstrating competence confidently.

Tutor ward sessions are conducted once in every 15 days for the students to share their experiences or difficulties faced in the process of learning and teaching. Tutors advise the students on regular attendance and review their performance in CIA tests. Based on the academic performance and attendance, students were given proper counselling. Remedial classes are arranged for the slow learners. The minutes of the Tutor-ward meeting is recorded and reviewed by the HOD in the department meeting along with the faculty members. Suitable action will be initiated for the development of the students. Actions required at the college level will be placed in the HODs meeting, and if required, the Principal will take the necessary actions. A tutor is followed for eachstudent on the basis of 1:30 ratio.

### 14.4 Class Committee Meeting

The college organizes class committee meetings to improve academic performance and resolve student grievances. The class committee meeting, convenedtwice in a semester, serves as a platform for the students to give their suggestions on the teaching-learning process and in curriculum revision, syllabus coverage, feedbackabout the faculty teaching and express their grievances, if any. A team of eight students, comprised of two fast learners, two moderate learners, two slow learners, and two class representatives, is formed. The meeting will be chaired by the respective head of the department, and senior members of the teaching staff will be attending themeeting to discuss the possible improvements that can be made during the semester. The meeting's outcome is presented to the Principal, and any necessary action is takenat the heads meeting.

### 14.5.Student Council

The college has an active student's council to represent the academic and co- curricular activities of the college. The principal of the college is the Chairman

of the Students Council. All the class representatives are the members of the student's council. The members of the student's council are selected on the basis of merit, i.e.one topper from each class. To promote opportunities for the development of character, leadership, efficiency, knowledge and spirit of service among students.

### 14.6 Suicide Prevention Cell

Sri Krishna Arts and Science College opened a Suicide Prevention Cell in the college premises. 


members gave an excellent speech about importance of trees and need for planting them. After that we too started planting them. Firstly, we removed the plastic that wrapped around the plants and we started to plant




