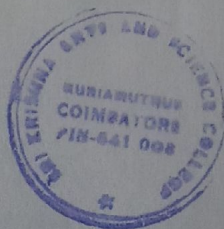






The Chairman of the Board of Studies welcomed the members for the meeting. The members took up the agenda for the meeting. The Chairman of the Board of Studies submitted the scheme and syllabus of 2021 batch as approved by Curriculum Development Cell (CDC) for the first and second semester for the discussion and approval.

The following are the highlights of the Curriculum introduced from the year 2021- 2022. All the Courses are grouped under five categories.

- Group I            - AEC – Ability Enhancement Courses    – 10 Courses with 30 credits
- Group II            -DSC – Discipline Specific Courses            – 15 Courses with 64 credits
- Group III           -DSE – Discipline Specific Electives           – 10 Courses with 34 credits
- Group IV           -GEC – General Elective Courses            – 5 Courses with 12 credits
- Group V            - ANCC – Audit Non-Credit Courses        – 3 Courses with Nil credits



The above structure has been framed by CDC and is applicable for all the Undergraduate Programmes in the college from the year 2021-2022 onwards. For Second and Final year students the existing structure introduced in the year 2020-2021 will be applicable.

The Chairman presented the salient features of the new curriculum and the Courses introduced to the members. The salient features are as follows.

In the previous academic year, for the B.A. English Literature Curriculum, the Department of English followed Age wise classification for studying the various Literatures but in the new scheme and it has been changed to form wise classification.

The following is the list of dropped Courses and the equivalent and New Courses introduced for the students admitted to B.A. English Literature Programme from 2021-2022 onwards.

Another feature of the curriculum introduced for the B.A. English Literature students admitted from the academic year 2021-2022 is the inclusion of two unique courses 1. **Academic Skills for English** in the first semester and 2. **Capstone Project** in the second semester which aims at the overall language skill development which is the essential feature of students who study Literature. As a requirement for the completion of these two courses students will be assigned various kinds of language exercises, mini projects, case studies and Role plays throughout the semester which would help in strengthening Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing (LSRW) skills. The syllabus is also upgraded by including the contemporary authors and their latest works so as to enable the students to be updated with the latest developments in the literary world.



Another salient feature of the new curriculum is the addition of innovative Teaching and learning and Assessment methods. The CDC has included the following methods in addition to regular methods like written tests, MCQs and Projects.

The Chairperson also explained the implementation of Outcome Based Education (OBE) and its modification from the year 2020-2021 which has been mapped in the syllabus. After the detailed presentation, the Chairman invited members to offer their suggestions and contributions to be included in the syllabus and it has been placed for discussion.

The following **minor changes** were made with the permission of the Board in the Syllabus of 2020-2021 B.A. English Literature Course:

- **DSC VI - 20ENU06 - American Literature** has been shifted from Sixth Semester to Third Semester for the UG students admitted during the academic year 2020 - 2021.
- **DSC XI - 20ENU11 - Indian Literature** has been shifted from Fifth Semester to Fourth Semester for the UG students admitted during the academic year 2020 - 2021.
- In the Course 19ENU14 – **Indian Literature** in the Second Unit the essay entitled “Indian Crowds” by Nirad C Chaudhuri has been replaced with the essay entitled “My Birthplace” by the same author due to the non-availability of former text.

The following were discussed and resolved with regard to the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 M.A. English Literature Programme.

- It was also resolved to retain the 2019-2020 batch M.A. English Literature Courses of the third and fourth semester with minor changes in two courses alone for the 2021-2022 M.A. English Literature students.
- Due to the previous BcS amendment the Course entitled **Principles of Journalism** had been shifted from Optional Course to Main Course and hence it was proposed to add **20ENP24 New Literatures** as one of the Optional Courses.
- It was proposed to newly introduce **20ENP21 DSC XVII: Literary Theory and Criticism** replacing the Course **19ENP21: Media Studies** of the previous academic year.
- It was also resolved to reintroduce the 2020-2021 M.A. English Literature Structure and Scheme in the newly framed Outcome Based Education (OBE) format for the M.A. English Literature students admitted from the Academic Year 2021-2022 onwards.





The Chairman of the Board of Studies welcomed the members for the meeting. The members took up the agenda for the meeting. The Chairman of the Board of Studies submitted the Scheme and Syllabus of 2021 Batch as approved by Curriculum Development Cell (CDC) for the first and second semester.

The following are the highlights of the Curriculum introduced from the year 2021-2022. All the Courses are grouped as:

Group II : DSC: Discipline Specific Courses - 16 Courses with 66 Credits

Group III : DSE: Discipline Specific Elective – 4 Courses with 16 Credits

Group IV : GEC: General Elective Courses – 3 Courses with 8 Credits

Group V : ANCC: Audit Non-Credit Courses – 1 Course with Nil Credits

Above structure has been framed by CDC and is applicable for all the post graduate programs in the college from the academic year 2021-2022 onwards. For second year students the existing structure introduced in the year 2021 will be applicable.

- Using this approach the students are assessed against external, absolute objectives instead of reporting the student's relative achievements.




